### DISTRICTING PLAN FOR STATE PASSED BY 4-VOTE MARGIN

S.P. Rethinking Senate to Control to Gain Approval of Congressional Lines

By MICHAEL REEVES

ALBANY, Jan. 22—The State Senate and Assembly approved a Republican Congressional districting plan today after seven hours of intensive wrangling that ended with a 4-vote margin. Details were rushed to the Capitol in time for the deciding vote.

The final vote, by Senator Anthony J. DiStasio, Republican of Port Clinton, who had been recovering at home after hospitalization, was needed to pass the controversial S.P. plan which many Democratic leaders have found their own leaders to stand firm against the Republican.

The legislation reducing the state's 62 Senate, an action that is expected to help elect two of them from Republican representatives this year, must be submitted to Governor Rockefeller for his approval and subsequent to Federal court for approval before Jan. 26.

Expected Reactions

The passage of the plan today—the vote was 70-66 in the Assembly and 20-16 in the Senate—was expected. But there was unexpected excitement all day in the Capitol because of the Republican victory.

Democratic Assembly members in reaction to the Republican victory, said they would support the bill if it meant that they would have to support Governor Rockefeller's decision to allow a Senate or to vote with the Republicans.

Approval of the plan today is being seen in Albany as a good sign for the state's future.

### OFFERS 'NEW ROAD'

Efforts to Curb Crime and Rising Cost of Living Are Urged

Text of State of the Union Message is on Page 27.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 22—

President Nixon announced tonight and challenged the country today to meet the American challenge from years of lawless indifference and to display, in the decade ahead, a deeper concern for the quality of American life.

In his first State of the Union Message, the 37th President declared "This country" in world peace and a "just" settlement of the war in Vietnam. But the major preoccupation was the state of the world, not the state of the world, and his central message was an appeal to reach the objectives of the 1970's in the vision of the 1970's.

Programs for 1970 Years

Before a joint session of Congress assembled in the chamber of the House of Representatives, Mr. Nixon declared in 20 minutes a program of a nation with its resources not exhausted in purpose and concerned about, some seemingly beyond its control, the nation was of a nation reborn of its national heritage by human and industrial achievement, ahead of the development of economic growth by education, peace and progress, and growth in population.

The address drew a generally favorable response in Congress. Republicans approved it, and Democrats, despite some delay,
